These are a few of the responses from volunteers who went to Albania with Steve this summer. Eight high school students and one college student volunteered, spending nearly three weeks in the villages. They were divided into two groups and team-taught conversational English in Vrithe, Boga and Xhaj. In Vrithe, local resident, Bernard Milaj was a huge help. As well as teaching English, they made a long weekend trip to Ulcinj, Montenegro on the Adriatic to swim and be tourists. Steve acted as chaperone, but these students were very responsible, and really didn't need much chaperoning. Steve took all of them on at least one

Letter from AAI President, Steve Cook

For the last few years, my trips have followed a pretty consistent pattern, but not 2017, when I had eight high school juniors from Corvallis High School and one Oregon State University student volunteering. I didn't teach any on my own this year but was kept busy facilitating the volunteer classes. We've decided to change our high school scholarship program to focus more on merit, based upon state graduation exams, and will continue with our current successful programs - small supplies/equipment, lending libraries, kindergartens and English language instruction. We will also continue to support qualifying university students.

We are excited to hire Vitore Leshaj as an art teacher in Boga and Xhaj. She will also manage the library books in Boga. And since the state only offers English language classes one day each week in Boga and Xhaj, we are now sending our English teacher, Aleks Vulaj to those schools one day a week to supplement the state program. Next year we will put on another Career Day which has proven to have much interest from the students.

Again a big thank you to all of you who continue to support our organization. The students in these small villages benefit so greatly from your generosity.
